Keep in mind that there were only four official teachers for the weekend: Robert Hauk (Portland) and Barbara Durr (Atlanta), Robin Thomas and Jennifer Bratt (NYC). The other teachers showed up to support the event and have fun!

In each of the classes teachers partnered with students to help with the figures we were learning. I didn't know Tom Smith from Minneapolis until I danced with him and thought 'oh my, what a heavenly lead!' He and his wife Tonya Smith later led a practica and I got to experience their teaching as well. We met Roxanne McKenney of St. Louis; Elayne Hency of Fayetteville, Arkansas; Brian Dunn and Deborah Sclar of Boulder, Colorado; Jason Laughlin and Gülden Ozen of North





Carolina; and Korey Ireland of Kansas City. To have that much talent in one room with absolutely no 'attitude' and a whole lot of caring was so inspiring.

Karen treated us like guests at the royal court, feeding us lavishly, and making sure we had everything we needed. On Saturday evening she served us prime rib for dinner, serenaded us with the live tango orchestra Tango Lorca, and then gave us the opportunity to dance until the early morning. Karen even had the ice cream truck stop by every afternoon to provide treats! In fact, the mayor welcomed us on Saturday night, and local businesses donated flowers, fudge, food, and support. It was easy to see just how much Karen is loved by her neighbors in Mt. Vernon and tango fans alike.

Though most of the dancers knew the basics of tango, for many of us it was our first experience dancing in close embrace. Robert and Barbara taught the first class in navigation skills, starting with the basics of close embrace, then moving in the line of dance in that position. They taught us turns and steps that were appropriate for crowded dance floors, but were also fun.

Throughout the rest of the weekend we made tough choices on which classes to take, knowing they would all be wonderful. A few of us split up and then later compared notes on what we learned in the different classes. Barbara and Robert taught advanced techniques, while Robin and Jennifer were teaching "Dancing to Pugliese, The Art of Doing Nothing."




Another difficult choice was between Robert and Barbara's vals class and the turning ocho cortados and embellishments that Robin and Jennifer taught.

I talked to a lot of other dancers to get their impression of the weekend, the instruction we received, and what they liked best. We awarded the 'stand up comic of tango award' to Robin Thomas for his inventive way of describing dance positions, root chakras, and bald spots (you had to be there to understand that one!). Fernando and Rebecca, a beautiful couple from Toronto with a romantic and inspiring personal love story, reminded us that love and tango belong in the same sentence. Tango Lorca gave us the gift of live tango music and it was truly magic. Most of all, the followers in our group wanted to thank the leaders who made sure that we all got to dance. The leaders who danced with us throughout the workshop and during the milongas will always be very special to us.



Letter to the Chicago **Tango Community**

To: The Chicago Tango Community

Date: August 23, 2004

As some of you may be aware, previously efforts were initiated to have a tango festival in Chicago in September this year. The primary genesis for organizing such an event with relatively little time was to capitalize on having both Gloria & Eduardo Arquimbau (sponsored by Tango Sentido Production Inc.) and Cecilia Gonzalez with Mario Consiglieri (sponsored by WindyCityTango, Inc. and Tango Ardiente) on the same weekend. A few of us thought we could add a couple of other instructors, perhaps some live music and have a four-day festival to promote Argentine tango in Chicago.

For a variety of reasons, a tango festival will not happen at this time. Nonetheless, Chicago is in store for an incredible week of tango! There will be workshops and showcases with these four phenomenal teachers and performers beginning as early as Sept. 21, so watch for the details to be provided on the Tango Noticias as well as other websites and distributed at local milongas, practicas and classes.

But, what about a tango festival in Chicago? Why would we want to have one? What would be involved in organizing such an event?

Dancers who have traveled to tango festivals around the country or the world probably are the most fervent in their requests to "put Chicago on the tango map". Why should most other major metropolises and many smaller cities host tango festivals and not Chicago (at least not in the past decade)? Having a festival here both would help promote Argentine tango to the greater Chicago populace by generating publicity and visibility and also would bring a variety of tango dancers to our wonderful city.

Having a Chicago tango festival is an idea several of us kicked around for a few years, some of us occasionally meeting, but nothing has yet moved forward. We now have an opportunity to work together to produce an incredible event - the first of many, I hope. I have no desire for this to be a WindyCityTango, Inc. event; I envision this as a Chicago tango community project, hence the working title -"Chicago = Tango Central."

For a Chicago tango festival to be a success, we all will need to work together. Many people already volunteered for the proposed event this month (thank you - your names are on file, and you'll be the first to be consulted about a planning meeting). Anyone who did not already volunteer, now is the time to become involved. Help make it OUR festival!

What's the concept?

The following points summarize some preliminary concepts, which are now open for discussion:

■ We need to find a weekend not only when there are not competing events for hotel rooms and studio space but also when the weather is hospitable for visiting instructors and dancers.

We need to agree on and prioritize a list of prominent Argentine tango instructors to contact for participation in the Chicago = Tango Central Festival 2005.

3 We need to determine the appropriate scale and budget for our festival. The idea would be to utilize the existing venues as well as our local teachers and DJs as much as possible.

We need to obtain sponsorships from a wide variety of businesses (e.g., from our personal service providers such as barber/hairdresser, shoe repair, restaurants, etc. to Argentine and other Latino wine importers/distributors, publications / media, consulates, vendors, etc.).

5 We need to create a mediaintensive promotional campaign. 6. We need to promote the festival, along with our regular Argentine tango activities, locally with creative approaches such as spontaneous public dances.

In order to organize a successful tango festival in Chicago we need commitment, consensus, cooperation and assistance from everyone in our community. All of us will benefit from the increased exposure of Argentine tango in Chicago. And, we'll finally put Chicago on the tango map, as it deserves to be.

Now is the time to indicate your interest and support - there are many, many tasks that will need to be accomplished - some now, some in a few months, some during the festival. An e-mail address -ChicagoTangoCentral@yahoo.com - has been specifically created for this purpose. Please respond – ASAP - as to your potential level of involvement. A "public" meeting to discuss concepts, dates, instructors, etc. will be organized within the next few weeks.

Dancing the Argentine Tango: a Three-Minute Love Affair By Max E. Valentinuzzi,

This article was originally published in the September 2001 issue of Tango Moments, a bulletin from the Tango Society of Minnesota (TSoM).

Not everybody can dance Tango. There are at least three requirements to do it properly: first, you have to learn its technique, the steps and multiple figures that usually adorn its waving movements; second, you must find the right companion; third, you have got to be inspired.

The first two conditions are relatively

one of the woman, or a man's right arm embracing a woman's waist, sometimes pressing her bosom against his chest, sometimes pushing with his elbow to signal her the beginning of an ocho, or his right thigh almost entangled between hers, or in a sentada (when literally she sits on him leaning on her right leg). Yes, there is body contact, indeed, innocent and insinuating, with the eyes closed while listening to a distant tango cry, wondering at its magic and aimlessly wandering through the floor. There are no words, no talking, but yet each partner is communicating deeply; a brief affair at that particular moment.

An old tango of the modern period (ca. 1945), entitled Así se baila el tango (This is the way to dance tango), says in its lyrics:

Así se baila el tango, mezclando el aliento, cerrando los ojos para escuchar mejor. Mientras el brazo, como una serpiente, Se enrosca en el talle que se va a romper.

This is the way to dance tango, mixing the breath, closing the eyes to better listen. Whilst the arm. as a (waving) serpent, tangles up around the waist which is about to break.


easy to fulfill because the former comes directly from your natural conditions and time devoted to its daily practice, as in any enterprise we undertake, while the latter depends on how you find and convince your prospective partner. The third, instead, oh, the third! How can I transmit the idea, the concept, the feelings and fantasies that go together, as in a complex and mixed bundle, along with dancing a tango?


Dancing a tango is a short-lived love affair, a fantasy. It does not matter whether you are familiar with your partner or not, most of the time you do not even know his/her name, but yet, during the dance there is body contact. It might be the right cheek of the man with the left

Oh, yes! It is a short-lived love affair, afantasy, give of yourself to it and to its magic, love your partner, feel the music and the many bandoneón cadenzas that will carry you as if riding on a sliding sleigh.

People, especially men, like to brag, and a tango dancer does not boast if he says, "I don't really know how many love affairs I had in my life, but I know they were countless!" He is telling the truth! And now, go to your next milonga and enjoy it more than ever before. Another partner will be waiting there to share his/her inspiration.
